Founding Convention a United Success

On August 8th, 9th, and 10th, a historic event took place at the Renaissance Orlando-Airport Hotel: the America First Party held its Founding Convention. In a spirit of unity and a shared mission to rip control of our nation from a bloated and self-serving aristocracy and return it to the people, delegates from 19 states established a party structure and adopted a principled platform. As the delegates completed their work one day ahead of schedule, notice was served: This is a new political force in America.

As the delegates arrived, friends, both new and old, cheerfully welcomed each other. It was clear that we were serious about the purpose for the meeting. Conversations seldom wandered away from the job that was facing delegates. The

focus of most of the discussions was how best to form a viable party and avoid the traps of so many other movements. It was obvious that all had come prepared to work.

Thursday morning, the first inperson meeting of the America First National Committee ("AFNC") began with the pledge of allegiance, an invocation, and a welcoming address by Dan Charles. Once the National Committee members from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts were recognized, the work began. The Rules Committee proposed a Constitution and several sets of rules that are designed to provide a flexible yet stable party structure that gets things done. All were adopted unanimously.

The National Committee then

credentialed the delegates to the National Convention. After hearing reports from the interim officers and committee chairs who had served in a temporary capacity since the founding of the party in April, it set about electing the members of the Operating Committee--the officers and chairs of the seven standing committees.

On Friday, the General Session of the Founding Convention opened with several welcoming speeches and a ceremony honoring the affiliated state parties by unfurling the flags of those states to form the convention backdrop. With many more states working toward affiliation, it is expected that by the next convention in July of 2003, all states

Who Are We? Why Are We Here?

Our beloved nation is in big trouble. When you look around, it is plain to see. It was not supposed to be this way. But, our problems can be solved.

Over the past 100 years, we have seen our nation transformed from а Constitutional Republic to a democratic tyranny. We see politicians bending to special interests and taxing us to buy We see our jobs and families votes. destroyed to feed global corporations and the World Trade Organization. We see those rights, granted not by man, but by our Creator, being attacked and undermined by an overreaching federal government. We see the emergence of a global government, elected by nobody, that seeks to usurp our Constitution and turn our sons and daughters into cannon fodder for the New World Order.

We are building this party to take this country back.

As this has happened, the Democrat and Republican parties have merged, both throwing off all semblance of principles and any loyalty to the Constitution or the American people.

These same politicians have continuously attacked our shared values. First, we needed to understand our mission: to elect candidates who will adhere to a set of principles based on the wisdom of our nation's Founders. We are not a club.

To that end, we adopted the mission statement that appears on this page. We also adopted a Statement of Principles, which appears on the next page, and a platform based on those principles at our founding convention. Together, these documents clearly define what it means to put America First.

Second, we needed to hit the ground running. We started in 8 states and have grown rapidly, finding quality leaders, party members, and candidates in more than 30 states in just a few short months.

Third, we needed to make it clear that we are building this party to take this country back. To do that we must unify the tens of millions of folks who agree with us, but are disenfranchised or trapped in ineffective or corrupt political parties. We must also reactivate those who have given up on our system.

If we are going to succeed, we need your help. Please join us. Together we can take our country back. Together we can put America First!

Statement of Principles

Preserve and Protect Our People and Our Sovereignty

- Support a military whose mission is to protect our nation, not police the world
- •Strengthen our borders and promote rational immigration policies
- Protect English as our common language
- •Seek friendship with all nations, but avoid entangling alliances
- •Work to maintain our nation's sovereignty and oppose all attempts to make our nation subservient to the precursors of global government
- Apply American values to our foreign policy

Promote Economic Growth and Independence

- •Restore accountability and Constitutionality to budgets and taxes
- •Promote tax policies that adhere to the Constitution, enhance individual freedom, encourage savings and investment, and promote the family
- •Eliminate unconstitutional portions of the federal government
- •Rebuild our manufacturing base and protect American workers
- Protect our right to fair trade and oppose free trade, exit NAFTA and the WTO
- •Help American businesses stay in America
- Promote a Buy American policy
- •End taxpayer bailouts of corporations and foreign governments
- Implement a self-sufficient energy policy

Encourage the Traditional Values of Faith, Family, and Responsibility

- •Protect and recognize the sanctity of all human life
- •Defend the traditional family unit based on one man and one woman
- Promote the primacy of parents in the lives and education of their children
- •Respect the free exercise of religion

•Recognize the Judeo-Christian heritage of our shared values

Ensure Equality Before the Law in Protecting Those Rights Granted by the Creator

- Defend the self-evident truth "that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness"
- •Preserve and protect all of the Bill of Rights
- •Oppose all quota systems. Merit and behavior must prevail
- •End judicial tyranny and restore balance to our political system
- •Restore property rights and restrict government land confiscation

Clean Up Our Corrupted Political System

- •Remove the primary source of corruption by sharply reducing the size and scope of the federal government to its limited powers under the Constitution, and return control over all other matters to the states
- •Require that all political donations be promptly disclosed and come from voters
- •Enforce fair, uniform standards for ballot and debate access to give voters more choice
- Implement clean election practicesrestore paper ballots
- Reform the lobbying system so that the only organizations permitted to lobby are those organizations whose money is acquired strictly from voter donations. Reasonable individual voter donation amount limits must be established
- •End lavish Congressional pensions-put them on Social Security
- Ban taxpayer funded Congressional campaign mailings
- •Restore the rights of states in the manner of choosing Senators and Representatives and promote the citizen legislator

The Statement of Principles of the America First Party was adopted at the first meeting of the National Committee on April 20, 2002.


The Principles provide an outline for the party's Platform, which contains a section for each of the Principles headings. Each Platform section then expands upon that particular set of principles.

The Statement of Principles is the core statement of beliefs of the America First Party. As such, a two-thirds vote of the National Committee is required to adopt any change to the Principles.

The Party Constitution binds both the National Committee and the National Convention to adopt a platform consistent with the Principles.

All party leaders are required to support and advance the Principles as a condition of holding a position of trust within the America First Party.

will be represented.

The next order of business was the adoption of the platform. The diligent work done by the platform committee was obvious as delegates reviewed each of the five component parts, which correspond to the five sections of the AFP Statement of Principles. Lively and informed discussions on various planks gave those in attendance a variety of perspectives on major issues facing the country.

Part I was titled "Preserve and Protect Our People and Our Sovereignty." This section defined a foreign policy that protects our sovereignty, gets us out of the UN, and keeps us out of wars that are none of our business. This section also describes the special role of the 2nd Amendment, the need to reform legal immigration and end illegal immigration, promote assimilation, and the need to return morality and constitutionality to our foreign policy. A later resolution condemned the use of military force in Iraq, particularly without a congressional mandate as required by the Constitution.

Part II is titled "Promote Economic Growth and Independence." The delegates adopted calls for responsible and constitutional federal spending, replacing the income tax with a national retail sales tax and tariffs, and trade policies that protect American jobs and industries.

Part III is titled "Encourage the Traditional Values of Faith, Family, and Responsibility." It included provisions on the role of the government in moral issues. The delegates took unwavering positions to protect human life, encourage adoption, oppose cloning and genetic manipulation, restore parental primacy and control over education, oppose homosexuals in the military, and support bedrock values of marriage and religious expression.

On Saturday, the convention covered parts 4 and 5 of the platform. Part IV is titled "Ensure Equality Before the Law in Protecting Those Rights Granted by the Creator." Delegates made it clear that the party takes positions that promote and protect the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights. Planks were adopted which promote treating each citizen as an individual, not as a part of a group; defending the privacy, property, and security rights of citizens; reaffirming states rights and the separation of powers; and opposing the Federal Reserve, federalization of police powers, and judicial activism.

Part V is titled "Clean Up Our Corrupted Political System." It included provisions to eliminate special interest budget influences, a restoration of constitutional governance, a return to ethical public service, a program of meaningful campaign finance and lobbying reform that makes the voter's voice preeminent, and a return to the paper ballot to eliminate election fraud.

Once the debate and amendment process was complete, the delegates adopted the platform unanimously.

Saturday evening saw the first America First Celebration banquet. Chairman Dan Charles delivered an inspiring speech, televised by C-SPAN, and AFP candidates Cameron Bates and James Edwards spoke to those assembled. They were an inspiration to the delegates who would see the message of the America First Party brought to voters around the country by intelligent, dedicated representatives.

Another candidate, political prisoner James Traficant, then delivered a specially videotaped message. He spoke of the true need for this new party to succeed. The country is in need of a new direction and a return to the Constitutional principles upon which it was founded, where public servants serve the public instead of their own interests--and nobody need fear their own government.

The inspiring and dedicated work by those attending the founding convention will carry the message of the America First Party throughout the nation. Our platform is the basis for a new political party that will become a voice for the populist, conservative, and tradition-minded citizens who seek a return to the principles of the Constitution.

America First Party Gets The Message Out...

The first four months of the America First Party's existence saw the release of fifteen media releases, each delivered by fax and email to over a thousand media outlets and hundreds of party activists. These releases, which raise the profile of the party and promote the party's issues, have garnered publicity on the wire services, cable news channels, newspapers, and radio programs across the country.

English Sí, Executive Orders NO (8/23): pushed the passage of HR 3333 to make English our nation's official language.

Founding Convention Unifies Behind Platform (8/19): described the astounding platform adopted unanimously at the party's founding convention.

AFNC Opens Founding Convention with Unity (8/14): described the National Committee's hard work at its first in-person meeting, including the adoption of a party constitution. **People's House Betrays the People** (7/24): denounced the cowardly vote by the House of Representatives to expel James Traficant on trumped up charges.

Rep. Traficant Set to Speak At Founding National Convention As Party Growth Continues (7/16): announced invitation to Traficant to Speak at our Convention.

Stop the Insanity: Impeach the Judges Now (6/27): Called for removal of federal judges who banned the Pledge of Allegiance.

Trade Deficit: Globalists Win-American Working Families Lose (6/20): deplored the record trade deficit and loss of jobs.

Return the Sunshine: Congressional Secrecy Sinful (6/19): demanded a public ethics hearing for James Traficant.

National Convention Set as Party Grows (6/4): announced party's Founding Convention in Orlando Florida. *NYC's Hypocrite Oath: Doctors to Learn to Kill (5/29):* denounced mandatory abortion training for New York City medical students.

Bush to Flying Public: Drop Dead (5/22): called for arming pilots to defend passengers.

Kill the Illegal Alien Amnesty Bill (5/15): Called upon Congress to deny amnesty to illegal aliens.

Uncap Domestic Oil and End Foreign Dependence (5/10): Called on Congress to expand domestic oil production.

New Party Formed: Mission & Principles Adopted (4/26): first public announcement of creation and positions of the America First Party.

Mass Exodus from Reform Party Begins (4/15): announced intention to start a new party based on principles that put America First.
